There are two options for the Grassroots Trust Kids Challenge: 1km (for 7 year olds only) and 2km (for 8-13 year olds).

The kids assemble in Collingwood Street for a fun warm up with **Team** Energize. They are ushered out for a nice and easy run of Victoria Street, starting from Garden Place. The runners head towards the Fairfield Bridge and back along Victoria Street. One loop of this course is the 1km Grassroots Trust Kids Challenge, two loops is the 2km Grassroots Trust Kids Challenge.

Note: Kids under 7 years old on race day cannot enter the Grassroots Trust Kids Challenge.
