

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Maungatautari Syndicate are excited to offer the opportunity for students to again bring their own Chromebook device to assist their learning in 2020.

What device should I buy?

We strongly recommend buying a Chromebook as it would require the student to login with their school account every time they use it. In this way we could better protect the student with their online safety. In 2020, some students brought existing family Chromebooks, which may be the easiest option for many parents. If you are looking at purchasing a new Chromebook here are a few facts to help you decide.

Chromebook

- · Choose one with robust screen and hinge design.
- . More than 4GB RAM.
- · Long battery life.
- · 11-12 inch screen. Because students need to bring home their device everyday and a screen size around 11-12 inch would be more lightweight and portable to carry.

What will it cost?

We have negotiated special deals with PB Tech and Noel Leeming for BYOD Chromebooks which you can find attached to this letter.

Can we bring any Chromebook

Yes. However, it is essential that the device has a battery life to last a full school day (chargers are not allowed at school). Any new Chromebook will achieve this, but older devices may have batteries that hold less of a charge.

If possible, we would recommend Chromebook models with 4GB RAM (working memory) to allow for better multi-tasking.

What else do we need to purchase?

It is highly recommended that students have a protective case/bag for their device.

How are Apps installed?

Chromebooks have Apps pre-installed against your student's @tamahere.school.nz account. So, when a student logs into a Chromebook with their @tamahere.school.nz address, they will have all of the school Apps in their Apps launcher. (Note, if your child does not know their @tamahere.school.nz account details this will be cleared up when they start school in 2021. Year 6 children in 2021 should already have this information.)

Can the devices stay at school?

We ask that students charge their devices at home. We have investigated installing charging lockable charging stations, but believe they are not a good solution due to cost, space and usage requirements.

If a student has a genuine reason to leave their device at school occasionally, they can negotiate this with their teacher who will ensure the device will be secure and charged for the next day.

How do I insure my device?

Please contact your insurance company to arrange policy cover for the device at school. When your child is not in class a lockable cabinet will be provided for your child to secure their device in.

What happens at the start of the year?

During the first week a Digital Citizenship programme will be run, after this, we will invite students to bring along their device, along with the attached and signed Student Agreement.

Is there anything to do once we purchase a device?

We have attached a How To Set Up Your Child's BYOD Chromebook Guide along with this letter, please set up your Chromebook accordingly after you purchase your Chromebook.

If you choose to use the Family Link App, please select **NO** at the option "Control for signing in" otherwise it will ask for a "Parent Access Code" every time your child needs to login their device.



How to Set Up Your Child's BYOD Chromebook

Complete the following steps to:

- 1. Become the 'Owner' of your child's Chromebook, so you can determine which accounts can sign into the device
- 2. Restrict access to certain Google accounts only
- 3. Turn off 'Guest Mode'

This is important to do, so you're certain that when your child is using their Chromebook on any network, they are signed in with their school Google account or a Family Zone protected personal account. If you do not do this, then they can sign in with an unmanaged account, or as a 'guest', and will not be protected.

Step 1: Become the 'Owner' of the Chromebook

This is essential, as only the 'Owner' of the Chromebook can determine the accounts that can sign into the device.

Think of the 'Owner' as the administrator of the device.

To become the 'owner' account, you must be the first person to sign into the device with a Google account when, the first time the device is used.

If you do not have a Google account (eg_someone@gmail.com) you can create one easily by following this link: https://accounts.google.com/SignUp?hl=en

What if my child signed into the Chromebook first?

If someone else (eg your child) was the first Google account to sign in, then THEY will already be the owner. This isn't a problem and is easy to fix -- simply reset the device by following the instructions linked to below. Then sign in with YOUR Google account username and password. You will then be the 'owner' of the Chromebook.

Need to reset the Chromebook? Follow steps in either option 1 or 2:

Factory reset your Chromebook

Option 1: Reset using shortcut keys

- 1. Sign out of your Chromebook.
- 2. Press and hold Ctrl + Alt + Shift + r.
- 3. Select Restart.
- 4. In the box that appears, select Powerwash > Continue.
- 5. Follow the steps that appear and sign in with your Google Account.

 Note: The account you sign in with after you reset your Chromebook will be the owner.account.
- 6. Once you've reset your Chromebook:
 - Follow the onscreen instructions to <u>set up your Chromebook</u>

Option 2: Reset using the Settings menu

- 1. Sign in to your Chromebook.
- 2. At the bottom right, select the time.
- 3. Select Settings
- 4. At the bottom, select Advanced.
- 5. In the "Powerwash" section, select Powerwash > Restart.
- 6. In the box that appears, select Powerwash > Continue.
- 7. Follow the steps that appear and sign in with your Google Account.

 Note: The account you sign in with after you reset your Chromebook will be the owner account.
- 8. Once you've reset your Chromebook:
 - Follow the onscreen instructions to <u>set up your Chromebook</u>

Step 2: Restrict access to your child's school account (and a Family Zone protected personal account. This is optional)

This is necessary so that your child can only sign in with their school-issued, managed Google account and any protected personal account (eg their own personal @gmail.com Google account) you want them to have access to. *Please do not do this step until your child's school has added your child's school-issued Google account to their device.*

Before completing this, make sure you have carried out step 1 above, to become the 'owner' account on the Chromebook.

To restrict access so your child can only sign in with their school Google account, complete the following:

1. Add your child's account to the device using the following instructions. If you have other family members who need to use the device (eg other child, spouse), complete the process again to add each of them so they can sign in as well.

Add a person to your Chromebook (your school may do this for you)

- 1. If you're signed in to your Chromebook, sign out.
- 2. On the bottom, click Add person.
- 3. Enter the Google Account email address and password, then click Next.
- 4. Follow the steps that appear.

2. Restrict sign-in so only those accounts you would like your child to have access to (and your own account) can sign in.

Let only certain people sign in to your Chromebook

- 1. Sign in to the Chromebook with the owner account.
- 2. At the bottom right, select the time.

- 3. Select Settings **
- 4. In the "People" section, select Manage other people.
- 5. Turn on Restrict sign-in to the following users.
- 6. You'll see a list of all the Google Accounts on your Chromebook. You can add or remove accounts from this list.

Step 3: Turn off 'Guest browsing'

This is important as it means your child must sign in with a known Google account and cannot browse as a guest. If they can browse as a guest, then the Family Zone software will not load and they will not be protected.

Turn off quest browsing

When guest browsing is turned off, users need to sign in with their Google Accounts to use your Chromebook. Learn more about guest browsing.

- 1. If you're signed in as a guest, sign out.
- 2. Sign in to your Chromebook using the owner account.
- 3. At the bottom right, select the time.
- 4. Select Settings .
- 5. In the "People" section, select Manage other people.
- 6. Turn off Enable Guest browsing.

IMPORTANT: You should regularly check your child's device to ensure that they have not reset it themselves. If they do reset it, then they can become the owner and remove the restrictions you have set up. To check, simply power on the device and check the accounts that appear on the sign in screen. Your account should have say 'owner' next to it, and there should not be a link to browse as a 'guest'. If this is not the case, then complete the steps above to regain ownership of the device and restrict who can sign in.
