# Kia ora Koutou, Nau mai, hoki mai Welcome back Everyone!

It is lovely to have all our tamariki back with us looking healthy and tanned ready for a new year of learning. The laughter and chatter in the playground is refreshing after working in silence for a while. I hope you have all had a very happy and relaxing holiday break with your children and that you have been able to enjoy the great New Zealand outdoors over a mainly sun-filled summer. What a wonderful country New Zealand is. We are so lucky to be living a normal happy life in our great space. I hope you were able to enjoy a number of family adventures and experiences. I know the teachers are re-energised and well prepared after a relaxing break, a few Teacher Only Days and planning sessions.

Let's hope that we can all enjoy a wonderful 2021 with no interruptions and COVID challenges - Yeah Right!

We realise this hope is probably not going to be a reality when we look around the world and the devastation and impacts of the COVID 19 virus. As a school we are going to keep on paddling our waka and enjoy the ride.

The journey will be savoured and celebrated along the way but we are also going to be prepared and aware that things may change rapidly. We understand that another lockdown could occur and will be following Government Guidelines.

We are starting straight away with our hand sanitising as we go into classrooms and washing hands thoroughly on the way out before we eat. By keeping ourselves healthy we can achieve more learning & teaching time for everyone. In line with Government requirements - Stay home when you are sick - and get tested if you have COVID symptoms. We ask that you please keep your children at home if they are feeling unwell.

Another system that worked well last year was the introduction of numbered gates. If you do not already have a specific family gate meeting point, can you please discuss this with your children and start to establish a routine of meeting at this gate, so if we do have to go back up the levels your children are relaxed and used to where they have to go by themselves.



Just a few reminders to keep us all paddling together harmoniously:

#### After School:

No child should leave the school grounds without a parent/guardian with them unless they are walking home using the road patrol crossing or are a senior, who is old enough to be biking. At 2.45pm if children are still on site, every student needs to go to After School Care to keep everyone safe. Here they will be given sandwiches and fruit and have buddies to play with.

#### When should we arrive in the morning?

Between 8.15am to 8.20am is a good time to come to school and we ask that children not go on the playgrounds before school. With our school day commencing from 8.30am, our teachers need to spend time before and after school preparing. We have teachers on duty from 8.00am, however before this time no students should be left unattended on our school site. We find that less time in the playground before school creates a smoother transition into learning.

We also ask that families dropping off and picking up students, especially those with pre-schoolers, try to avoid distracting classes at either end of the day. Playing in sandpits, etc is very distracting for a student who wants to be outside.

Any students that arrive before 8.00am must go to Before School Care (BSC) in the Koromiko Suite for their safety. They must be signed in by their parent or caregiver and you will be invoiced. The fee structure for BSC is set at \$10.00 per day, per child, capped at \$40.00 per week, with the fee for a family capped at \$100.00 per week.

We have a number of disability car parks available and we ask that you leave them free at all times for those who need them.

We all want to be together, paddling our waka happily in the same direction to clear waters and success!

### **Tragic Loss**

It is with huge sadness that we share with you the passing of a young and bright star from our wider school family. Hugo Colin Shaw, son of our wonderful reliever Hayley Shaw, passed away towards the end of the holidays, when his bicycle and a rubbish truck collided at Papamoa. Hugo attended St Peters School and was a keen and able sportsman and academic. He was also a kind and humble student who strived to do his best in all areas. Our hearts go out to Hayley and her family and to Hugo's many friends. A terrible tragedy - a life cut way too short. Aroha nui. Kia kaha.

### **Tamahere Model Country School App**

We are happy to announce the arrival of our new school app for mobile phones. This does not replace the website, but instead adds to our options. Our website will still exist with its usual features that you can refer to. The purpose of the app is to provide an 'in the moment' connection portal to keep you posted with current happenings. The features of this app include: weekly newsletter, daily notices, contact information of how to reach the school office and a link to absentees (found under the contacts section).



How to load the app:

The app can be located through the app store under, 'skool loop'. Once you have downloaded the app to your phone you then follow the steps for selecting your school. All you need to do is type in Tamahere Model Country School inside the app and then the app will prompt you on what to do next. You will be asked if you want to subscribe to groups. A list of a range of sporting and year group options are available. We advise that you select your groups as this will give you access to push notifications with information pertaining to these groups. If you don't select groups you may miss content you are interested in.
