

PB4L - Positive Behaviour for Learning


As a school we have embarked on a journey of professional learning around enriching our vision. Part of this has been furthering our school wide approach in supporting a positive behaviour for learning environment. Through this training we are now identified as a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) school.



Our PB4L professional learning began at the beginning of 2020 - and is a longitudinal development identified to take at least 5 years to fully embed. We are very excited about the learning and discussions this training has provided and look forward to the journey ahead.

PB4L develops a common language for students, staff and the community, as well as presents increased clarity around what this looks like at Tamahere Model Country School for all. Part of this language is reflected through vision statements that we have grown through consultation with staff,

students and community. Each week the teachers focus on a vision statement, unpacking with the students what this looks like in various settings around the school. These are also reflected in our class, playground and Principal Awards. Last week the focus was "I am kind and inclusive" and the teachers selected one student from their class to receive the Principal Award this week, with this focus in mind.

Skool Loop App

The features of this app include: weekly newsletter, daily notices, contact information of how to reach the school office and a link to absentees (found under the contacts section).




How to load the app:

The app can be located through the app store under, 'skool loop'. Once you have downloaded the app to your phone you then follow the steps for selecting your school. All you need to do is type in Tamahere Model Country School inside the app and then the app will prompt you on what to do next. You will be asked if you want to subscribe to groups. A list of a range of sporting and year group options are available. We advise that you select your groups as this will give you access to push notifications with information pertaining to these groups. If you don't select groups you may miss content you are interested in.

Our aim is to provide a portal that allows you to be further connected with our school through a simplified and streamlined process.

Family Zone

A community approach to online safety benefits students at school, as well as at home. As previously shared, as part of our ongoing commitment to ensure students' safety and well-being, we have introduced cyber safety programs and technologies in partnership with Family Zone.

Family Zone helps us to ensure our students are safe and on task during school time and offers parents a range of options for monitoring and supporting their children's online journey.

We are committed to creating a cyber safe environment for our school and are taking a holistic and long term view. The program includes these key initiatives:

Cyber Safety Hub: The Hub is an online resource which has been developed to keep our community safe across the School's cyber safety program and provides the latest on cyber safety topics and issues. It also includes information on Family Zone and how it can benefit your family.

1. Monitoring and Filtering: To ensure student use of technology at school is compliant, we

- have installed Family Zone technology into the school network, student accounts and on all student learning devices.
- Parental Monitoring Tools: To support parents we will be providing you with access to a
 monitoring tool called <u>Family Zone Insights</u>. You can use this account with your child's
 school and personal devices.



We have increased the settings so that our school Google accounts will still be covered in your home, if someone signs in through the Chrome Browser.

It is entirely up to your family as to what safety management systems you want at your home. If you would like to create a Family Zone Account, please go to our school's <u>Cyber Safety Hub</u> to create a <u>Family Zone Insights</u> account.

With this account you can:

- Monitor your child's internet use outside of school hours;
- Disable school policy for your child's school holidays or sick days; and
- Optionally install Family Zone onto your children's personal devices.

If you have any worries about cyber safety at school, please discuss your concerns/challenges with your classroom teachers.
