Roaring 20's Fundraising Gala Ball



Hi everyone,

We have continued to progress with our work on the northern side of SH21 over the past week. You will now see that a section of the new footpath has been poured, and at the eastern (Regal Haulage) end of this section we are continuing with the alignment and fence construction.

The service providers are working away at the service relocations, and you will continue to see teams working in the road shoulder to complete these works.

Next week we will be completing tree felling outside the Tamahere Country Club, where two trees need to be removed to make space for the underpass construction. This will take place on Monday 17th and Tuesday 18th May, and during the work hours of 9am – 3pm we will need to close the road for up to 5 minutes at a time, when specific branches are being removed. We'll keep any disruption to a minimum, and have ensured this work takes place outside peak traffic periods. Prior to the work taking place we will be inspecting the trees for any bats that may be roosting at the time, to ensure these are not disturbed by our work.

As well as this work continuing we are working away on other activities that can be completed prior to Fieldays, and we will communicate these as they take shape over the next few weeks.
