#### SH21 Underpass Project Update from Downer's Matt Kofoed

Hi everyone,

We had another solid week on site last week. Service installations have continued in multiple areas of the site, and some of these are close to being completed. Unfortunately we have been unable to remove the existing power poles at this stage, and as such will need to wait until late-June to complete this.

With Fieldays coming up in just a couple of weeks our focus is shifting to working in the area between State Highway 21 and Tamahere Drive, where a shared path will be constructed to link between the underpass and the existing shared path on Tamahere Drive.

After Fieldays we will then return to working on the State Highway, and the construction of the underpass itself will take place in the coming months. We'll release more detail on this in the near future, once we have dates confirmed.
