ASSESSMENT & REPORTING

If you missed last week's newsletter, we wanted to draw your attention to the information we shared about our Mid Year Reports for 2021.....

Assessment and reporting on learning are core practices at Tamahere Model Country School. We have a well-planned teaching and learning model as well as a carefully scheduled assessment plan. Throughout the year students are assessed in many ways. Some of these ways are informal including observations of classroom interactions and conversations during the learning process. Other methods are more formal and include tests that are standardised and norm-referenced. The process of deciding where a student is working in relation to the N.Z. curriculum is made with the support of colleagues and a moderation process that is shared with all staff members. Assessments are used along with teacher judgement to determine where a child is working *independently and most of the time*.

After the July holiday break, we will be sharing with you the mid-year reports for 2021. In early Term Three, we will be inviting families into school for a parent/student conference and this is a time to unpack the reports in more detail. The report is a snapshot of where the students are working independently in the **middle of the year**.

Students have two more terms of learning to go before we report on their end of year results. In December you will receive an end of year report that will show where your child is working after a full year of learning. There is still a great deal of teaching and learning to take place between now and December.

Below is a further explanation of the process of reporting to the Board and parents.

Mid Year Reports 2021

In July (Term Two), 2021, all teachers will provide every parent with a written report outlining their child's progress in relation to the N.Z. Curriculum.

The report provides parents with:

- Information on their child's progress in Reading, Writing and Maths and the other curriculum areas. This report will show where each student is achieving in relation to the end of year expectations for Years 1-6.
- The curriculum expectations can be expressed as curriculum levels. These are as follows:
- o At the end of Year One (Early Level One)
- o At the end of Year Two (At Level One)
- o At the end of Year Three (Early Level Two)
- o At the end of Year Four (At Level Two)
- o At the end of Year Five (Early Level Three)
- o At the end of Year Six (At Level Three)

SH21 Underpass Project Update from Downer's Matt Kofoed

Hi everyone,

I hope you had a good weekend, and that everyone who visited Fieldays had a great time.

While we have been off State Highway 21 for the past few weeks, we have been working in the future shared path area between State Highway 21 and Tamahere Drive, and this is now taking shape. We have also continued with our work on the new footpath alignment on the northern (Tamahere Park) side of the road.

We will now be moving back onto the State Highway, and starting to prepare for the weekend work that is coming up in a few weeks time. Since we first advertised this a fortnight ago we have revised our intended traffic management plan, and instead of utilising stop/go we will detour south-westbound (Airport bound) traffic down Tamahere Drive, Day Road and Pencarrow Road. Traffic heading north-east (towards State Highway 1) will use State Highway 21 as normal.

This change will minimise traffic delays by keeping everyone moving, and will ensure that any potential queues at intersections are minimised.
