Week 1 Happenings:

Haere mai, welcome back everyone. I hope you had a very happy holiday with your children and were able to enjoy some of the lovely sunny days outside.

It is always great to have the classrooms filled with smiling faces, curious questions and our playgrounds filled with childrens' shouts and laughter again. Everyone is looking so refreshed and ready to get back into the mahi.

As you will see, there have been alot of property projects undertaken over the holidays, which thanks to the Ministry's support will make a tremendous difference for our school going forward. The complete replacement of our six septic tanks with new chambers and pipes linking to our current system, is a significant one for us. Over the next holiday break the outside filtering and processing part is hoped to be installed, when the ground is a bit drier.

We have also had new joinery installed into most of our junior classes, which has made a dramatic difference to the natural light coming into those rooms and eliminating the drafts. The new roofing verandahs erected outside After School Care -Koromiko Suite and from Nikau One to Kawakawa Three look very smart but we still need to add the flashing for water tightness.

Unfortunately not all our projects were completed due to various issues, so there will be workers on site completing the finer details for all three projects.

With heavy trucks, lots of rain and soft ground we now have some very muddy parts of our school so unfortunately **Gate 1** by the swimming pool will be locked until the area is re-grassed and able to be walked on again. We are sorry for the inconvenience. **Gate 2** by our new classroom block is now open for access, but again we ask that everyone stays off the grass/mud areas.



It is wonderful to now have Horopito 20 and Horoeka 21 in operation for our youngest students. We now have 33 young students in this lovely new learning environment. The staff are also enjoying their sunny and spacious new staffroom. We are still awaiting new furniture for some areas but having more space to operate in is fantastic.







Harakeke 18 will become our music room for Mrs Weston's music lessons for all of our Pirongia and Maungatautari students, a place that our choir can use for practice and for the Chess Club to meet in. Puriri 5 will be used for the drums, withdrawal groups and for some of our Kids Clubs to operate from e.g French Lessons and Bricks4Kids.

SH21 Underpass Project Update from Downer's Matt Kofoed

Hi everyone,

Our super weekend of work to complete the underpass construction has almost gone to plan, with the only outstanding item being the final seal layer on the road. Unfortunately the overnight rain prevented us from being able to apply this, and we are now planning to complete this as soon as the conditions allow us to. Until this point in time we will monitor the existing surface, to ensure that any potholes are repaired quickly. During this time we do ask that you drive to the temporary speed limit of 50km/h; please note that this may be reduced to 30km/h if the surface does start to deteriorate.

In the end the excavation of the area was completed quickly due to the sandy material, and the placing of the underpass sections progressed well. The backfilling of the material around the underpass sections was time-consuming, however in the end the team were able to complete this yesterday. Even with the rain that arrived yesterday afternoon we were able to work through and successfully completed the vast majority of the tasks required.

We thank you for your patience over the weekend, as there were a few delays driving past the site at peak times. It was great to see the interest from passers-by, either on the new footpath by Tamahere Park, or those up on the 'hill' in the Tamahere Country Club. I even brought along a couple of potential next generation Downer employees for a visit!

The project team have earned a couple of days rest, however we will have crews disestablishing the area after

the weekend, and then we will be focusing on the construction of the wider underpass area. Also coming up in the near future are more power pole removals from Waipa Networks, in the Church grounds and on Tamahere Drive.

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Community Music School - Saturday Morning Music Classes
