#### Dads Army Working Bee - 17th July

Calling all Dads Army troops and anyone else keen to get involved and help out for a few hours over the break. If you haven't signed up to the Facebook Group then feel free to do so <u>here</u> or by contacting Mike Calvert directly (details below).

Mr Wickens is looking for a bit of help on Saturday 17th July. This being the middle of the school break, I realise that quite a few of you will be away, so I'm realistic in my expectations of who might be available. On the other hand there will be no Saturday morning sport, so perhaps, for some of us at least, it's a good chance to get together and dust off some power tools...and perhaps reward ourselves with a beer or two afterwards. If the weather is awful on



Saturday we'll do Sunday the 18th of July instead. There are two jobs that are priorities:

A fence needs to be constructed between the newly built block and the front gate area, identical to the one beside the staffroom. If anyone has a heavy-duty drill (portable or electric) to assist the work that would be great. Most of the work will involve drilling, sawing and placement of the timber (including lattice). 4 guys would be enough for this job.

The second job involves painting the joists on the verandah roof of Rooms 1-3. The existing Clearlite will already have been removed and the joists will also have been water-blasted. Some undercoating will be

needed and then all joists given a topcoat. This work is essential before the roofer puts new iron on the decking roof.

Finally, if time allows, there's some wood chip that will need to be spread around the school. As usual, the jobs will be completed no more than 4-5 hours after starting. We'll go for a more relaxed 10am start to allow for dew/frost to clear. Needless to say that afterwards, we will have the usual feed and refreshments.

The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment. Your child will be presented with high-quality, expert-developed questions, allowing them to apply their learning without the need for prior study or revision.



It is important to mention, during the process of identifying Year 6 academic cup winners, part of the overall teacher judgement does take into consideration the ICAS results. With this in mind, you need to consider as a family, the need for your child to participate in these exams if appropriate.



#### SH21 Underpass Project Update from Downer's Matt Kofoed

Hello everyone,

I hope you had a good weekend, and managed to stay warm!

In last week's update I advised that Waipa Networks had been unable to remove the existing power poles due to wet weather, and were re-planning for when they could attend site to remove these. They have now confirmed that their revised date for this work is Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> July.

This date is after the planned commencement date for the underpass construction, however we require the power poles to be removed prior to the underpass construction, so we can build a temporary road where the power poles currently sit. As such we will be postponing the underpass construction, which will now commence at **midday Friday 23**<sup>rd</sup> **July, running until 5am Monday 26**<sup>th</sup> **July**. If required we will also use the following weekend (Friday 30<sup>th</sup> July – Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> August) to complete the work.

We apologise for this postponement, however the cause of this is outside our control. We will be updating our communication that has been sent out to date (such as letter drops) and starting a wider communication programme next week.

Aside from this announcement we are still working across the site, continuing the shared path construction and footpath construction on the northern side of the road.
