

#### **ICAS Exams - Year 4-6**

If your child has been identified as achieving above or well above we invite you to consider entering your child into ICAS this year. The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment. Your child will be presented with high-quality, expert-developed questions, allowing them to apply their learning without the need for prior study or revision.



It is important to mention, during the process of identifying Year 6 academic cup winners, part of the overall teacher judgement does take into consideration the ICAS results. With this in mind, you need to consider as a family, the need for your child to participate in these exams if appropriate.

We appreciate there is a level of cost with these exams, so if any assistance is required please contact Lisa Boyd or Waveney Parker.

#### SH21 Underpass Project Update from Downer's Matt Kofoed

Hi everyone,

I hope you managed to stay dry over the weekend, hopefully we get some better weather this week!

We have continued to work outside the State Highway 21 area, with work continuing on the northern (Tamahere Park) side, as well as through the future shared path area. The attached photos show the 'root bridges' we have constructed in the shared path area. The concrete footpath will sit on top of these, which will ensure the tree roots can survive and thrive underneath. This future-proofs the area, ensuring the path will not be damaged by the tree roots.

Waipa Networks have unfortunately been unable to remove the power poles on the southern side of State Highway 21, due to the continuous rainfall on Sunday. We're working with Waipa Networks on a new date for this work to take place.
