CROSS COUNTRY - TOMORROW:

Our annual School Cross Country will be held tomorrow, Friday 17th September at our school using the Tamahere Reserve. Unfortunately under Delta COVID Level 2 we cannot have parents, grandparents and supporters on our grounds. We are very lucky that our course runs right across the Tamahere Reserve, so that spectators can be standing 2 metres apar,t on the Reserve playground area or outside the school grounds, on the Devine Roadside - away from where our students are running. We ask you to be at least 8 metres away from students, as many of you will be cheering them on.



The weather forecast looks a little cloudy but perfect for our Cross Country. If the weather does not cooperate our postponement day is next Monday 20th of September.

Maungatautari Syndicate will be holding their cross country event at 8.45am and the Pirongia Syndicate at approximately 9.45am, with the Taupiri cross country starting at approximately 11.00am. As this event is spectator free, our times are flexible.

Children are to wear their <u>Whanau shirt, suitable running shorts</u> (skorts are okay, along with uniform shorts and running shoes). Please ensure your child brings a change of warmer uniform to put on after their race, as they may get wet, muddy and cold. We strongly suggest they also bring a towel and bag suitable for their muddy belongings to go in. Please make sure your child has plenty of food and water.

<u>Disclosure of Risk:</u>- Below are the possible risks your child could be exposed to on this day and the safety measures that are in place.


- 1. **Medical Safety** All students / parents are asked to ensure each child has their asthma inhalers with them and epi pens and other medication where required. Please ensure your classroom teacher is aware of your child's medical conditions. Our teachers are 1st Aid trained and we will have first aid kits available.
- 2. Exhaustion / dehydration / exposure All children need to have plenty of food and drink for the day and sunscreen along with enough warm clothes in case the weather changes. The forecast is for rain so a waterproof raincoat, outside of our uniform may be carried if it provides more protection than our uniform.
- 3. Injury through falls and trips: This is a public reserve so we do not know what may have fallen to the ground. Shoes must be worn at all times. Our teachers are 1st Aid trained and we will have first aid kits available.
- 4. **Stranger Danger:-** There will be marshals around the course and students will only be using school toilets. Under Delta Level 2 no extra adults are allowed onto our school grounds.
- 5. **Loss -** Every year whanau shirts and other items seem to go missing please ensure all clothing items are clearly named and there are bags to carry them home.





Traffic switches ahead

A series of SH1 traffic switches will affect Tamahere residents and commuters over the next few months. First, traffic lanes will be shifted at the Southern Interchange to provide room to build a large gantry over the expressway to carry large directional signs. Then the Bollard Road temporary intersection with SH1 will be closed and local traffic moved onto their permanent access over the East West Link Road. Timeframes are yet to be confirmed following the Covid-19 project shutdown.
