





# SH21 Underpass Project Update - 21st September 2021

Hi everyone,

I hope you have been keeping safe and well. Due to the lack of alert level changes last week we decided that an update was not necessary.

The announcement yesterday that Auckland will drop to Alert Level 3 from tonight will allow us to work with suppliers in the Auckland region to understand delivery timeframes, which will then inform our overall programme of works.

In the meantime we have continued to progress with preparing the southern 'portal' of the underpass, which is the entrance/exit area from the underpass that goes under the road. Our aim is to pour the floor of this area next week.

As our programme takes shape over the next few weeks we will be able to provide more detail on how we will progress moving forward.
