




PIRONGIA SYNDICATE - AUTHOR VISIT























An Update on Term 4's Flippa Ball League

SH21 Underpass Project Update - 2nd November 2021

Kia ora koutou,

I hope that you had a good weekend – and we can now look forward to a few more freedoms from tomorrow!

On Saturday we received and placed the first set of pre-cast concrete wall panels for the underpass ramp on the southern (Country Club) side of the road. As the attached photo shows, you can now see the ramp taking shape. At the far end you can also see the stairs that will be constructed as well, with concrete pours for this area taking place over the next three weeks.

We are now looking ahead to Friday 12th November, when we will receive the next set of pre-cast panels to place on the southern side ramp.

Towards the end of the month we will alter our traffic management set-up on State Highway 21 to allow access to both sides of the underpass. Currently planned for the night of Sunday 21st November, there will be additional barriers installed on the northern side of the road, and road markings changed slightly. Accessing both sides of the underpass helps us speed up delivery of this project, with minimal impact on road users.
