We are delighted that we will be able to welcome all of our students back on site, face to face, for some days from later next week. How wonderful, to have our children with their chatter and laughter filling our school with life and vibrancy once again.



There is still information coming through, from the Ministries of Education and Health, around more specific guidelines for us to follow. As you will appreciate, due to differences in physical

surroundings, classroom cohorts and different systems, every school in the country will end up looking a bit different, each with our own unique bespoke approach.

Our staff are working hard to ensure our new systems and practices are going to work for the different age levels, class group numbers and the facilities we have. We are also very mindful of the endless challenges that you as parents are facing in your bubbles. Each one has your own unique combinations with juggling children of different ages, different businesses and occupations etc, etc. The complexities are endless and no system is going to work completely happily for everyone. Please bear with us, as we are endeavouring to achieve the best system we can but I am still awaiting the Ministry's promised guidelines later today.

Will your children be returning to us during Level 3?

Please <u>click here</u> to give us feedback if your child/children will not be returning to school under Level 3 restrictions. We need to allow space between all students across our site and this will be extremely useful for us. Please let us know before 8.00am tomorrow (Friday) morning to help us with our planning.

Tomorrow we will let you all know what our school's organisation will look like for next week and which days your children will be coming into school. We will endeavour to make this as seamless for families as possible. Please make sure all children know which gate you will be using for drop offs and pickups. You may want to choose a less busy gate to spread people out more at peak times.

Please <u>click here</u> for information around many of the **guidelines** we will be needing to follow once students are back at school. It would be wonderful if you could try and explain why and what we are doing to your children so they have a better understanding of what they are coming back to. One big one is the new mandate that **all Year 4 - 6 students must wear a mask all day!** We know this is going to be very hard for all of our students and teachers alike, but I have just come out of a Ministry meeting and only medical exemptions can be accepted for not wearing a mask. Again it would be great if you can get some comfortable masks for your children to wear and help them to practice and understand that they have to wear them for the entire school day. Any Year 0-3 travelling on the school bus will also need to be wearing a mask. Our Taupiri teachers are allowed to teach without masks in those younger classes.

For your peace of mind, all of our Teachers on site are fully vaccinated, our Administration and Teacher Aides have all had at least one vaccination.

Teacher Only Day:- So as not to cause confusion to a brand new system, our scheduled Teacher Only Day on Monday 22nd November will **no longer be happening.** Teachers will still need to have some down time though, to finalise their report comments and other documentation. We will endeavour to achieve this through internal measures.

Start date for 2022 - Our start day for the 2022 school year will be Wednesday 2nd February 2022. Let's hope by then we are all back together normally again.
