<u>FAMILY USAGE OF OUR SCHOOL'S VELA SWIMMING POOLS:</u> Thank you to all those who replied to our survey about family use of our swimming pool complex over the summer holidays and weekends. Thank you especially, to those who also committed to purchasing tickets to help us with running costs. There have been many Zoom meetings and much debate within the Board, along with number-crunching and creativity to come up with a way we could make this casual family swimming viable.

Then COVID, once again, came along to change our plans. There is currently a high level of uncertainty

around what we are able to allow on a school site. At present, no extra adults are allowed onsite. The ability to check vaccinations and keep people distanced within changing rooms, along with retaining staff who may get very few hours, has added to our challenges. Because of this the Board has decided not to open the pool complex for family swimming this summer. We have been exploring other funding options and will make further decisions next year when the Delta Variant has shown how life will look, and when we have all options available to us.

Community use is still important to us and we have managed to achieve Learn to Swim Lessons, through Hamilton Aquatics for the next three weeks with a number of new systems in place to comply with the COVID regulations.

We are also happy to hire the facility to organisations such as Water Polo, Aqua Jogging and other groups who through their own staff can develop systems that comply with all Government COVID and Health & Safety regulations.

By Term 1 2022, all levels of swim school will be able to operate from our school Vela Pool Complex under Hamilton Aquatics stewardship.

Once again, we thank you for your support and apologise that the pools will not be operating for casual swimmers this summer.

FLEXIBILITY IS HOW WE ARE ROLLING:

The following dates and events are to give you an indication of what we are planning but with parents not being able to come onsite and numbers restricted in the TCC, most of our gatherings will be held outside, spaced out and in areas where we find are most suitable at that time. We are going to be hugely weather dependent with our activities and will be changing times and locations at speed, so that children are not left out in the heat or adversely in the pouring rain. Some events, for example prizegiving, we are going to try to video. We are sorry that you can't be with us. Let's hope that we can all be together again in 2022!

Koru Design for Entranceway

Kapa Haka Uniform Design

What do you think?

We are still keen to hear more views on our proposed Kapa Haka uniform design. We have three design options at this stage unless, again, someone has a skill or talent to create something different for us. Maybe in line with the new designs we are talking about above.



1. The colours are not quite right yet but this design celebrates our logo and school colours and the repeated colour pattern shows the rays radiating outwards - *Kia atawhai aa mua - Kia tipu Ngatahi, Nurturing our Future Growing Together.*



2. This design may be more traditional with the stepping up of the Tukutuku pattern in a learning style.



3. The third option is similar to the first but the colour combinations have been changed to make it more of a geometric frame.

The final design will go on our Tipare, Tatua and Kakahu.



SH21 Underpass Project Update - 15th November 2021

Kia ora koutou,

We have continued to construct the temporary structures to allow the stair construction to occur on the southern (Country Club) side of the underpass, and the stair itself is being poured this week.

We are also busy preparing the next section of ramp, ahead of the panel delivery on Wednesday. Once these have been delivered and placed you will be able to see the structure from the State Highway, and will give a good perspective on how far we have come.

You will also see our team on the northern (Tamahere Park) side of the site, as we commence sheet piling on this side, and then make the changes to the traffic management layout this coming weekend. Once this is in place we will commence the excavation of the ramp area on this side.

I must also advise you that I move on from Downer at the start of December; Victoria Cooper, will provide monthly updates moving forward from December onwards. With our most disruptive work completed we are looking forward to the completion of this project in the first quarter of 2022. Thank you for your understanding throughout this project to date, especially during the earlier disruptive stages, and also as we have navigated through the Covid-19 enforced lockdown period and subsequent return to work.
