






Save The Date!!!!

SH21 Underpass Project Update - 14 December 2021

Kia ora koutou,

The team have made great progress in the lead up to Christmas.

On the southern (Country Club) side of the underpass the wall panels are in place, the ramp floor has been poured and the stairs constructed. This week will see the team backfilling behind the wall panels in preparation for removing the temporary sheet piling.

The wall panels for the northern (Tamahere Park) ramp is being delivered on Friday. To install the panels, a crane will be positioned in Tamahere Park on the fence line closest to the ramp. While this work is being undertaken, pedestrians and cyclists are asked to follow a temporary detour through Tamahere Park.

Over Christmas our team will be on a well-deserved break. Their last day on site is Thursday 23 December, returning Wednesday 5 January. During this time, we will have staff regularly monitoring the site.

On behalf of Downer, I'd like to wish you all a safe and happy Christmas.


