Learning Conferences: Wednesday 6th & Thursday 7th April

We miss seeing you around and catching up with those casual one to one chats! :)

Our teachers are really looking forward to meeting with you properly (but with masks on!) at our end of term Learning Conferences. Following yet another unusual term of learning, and the disjointed learning journeys your children have experienced over the past 3 years, our teachers would like to keep these meetings *kanohi te kanohi* - face to face, with just parents and teachers present, so that you can all cover as many bases as possible. We feel that you are also very keen to meet up and have a solid conversation.

Our Learning Conferences (Parent Teacher Interviews) will run from 2.20pm through to 7.00pm on Wednesday 6th April and from 2.50pm till 5.20pm on Thursday 7th April.

Maungatautari with the larger class sizes, will be starting at the earlier time of 1.20pm on Wednesday and their children will be catered for during this extra time.

Please note: On Wednesday we will be having a shortened lunch hour and the school day will finish at the earlier time of 2.00pm. The bus will be running half an hour earlier and After School Care will also start half an hour earlier.

Normal school hours will resume on Thursday 7th April, with our learning day concluding at the usual time of 2.30pm. Conferences will start after this.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused by our early conclusion of learning on Wednesday.

One Conference per child: So that each teacher can discuss a child's learning journey in depth with parents and caregivers, and to ensure everyone is on the same page, we ask that all parents join together for this occasion. This will help everyone involved to understand the issues and know how best to provide the support required for each child. It will also enable teachers to have the time needed to achieve conferences for every student in their class. There are not enough spaces for our split family parents to have an appointment each. We appreciate your support in this matter.

COVID Complications: If you are **unable to attend** your child's conference due to COVID challenges, please email the classroom teacher(s) concerned and they will send you a Google Meet or Zoom Link and slot you into a free gap on these evenings, so that you don't miss out.

Please let them know early on, so that they can fit you in.

Tamahere History Shared:

A very special taonga for the Tamahere Community. In case you may have missed the significance of the murals on the new underpass, here is the information and some great history of our area.

TŪTOHU WHENUA TAMAHERE UNDERPASS UNVEILED

Yesterday we joined with our whanaunga Ngāti Koroki Kahukura to unveil and bless artworks situated at the SH21 Underpass at Tamahere. The artworks were designed by our very own Weka Pene (Rukumoana Marae) who was unable to attend the blessing yesterday.

Weka shares some of the korero that informed the concepts for the artworks.

The intention of the designs that envelop the underpass, is to acknowledge the mana of the people and the history of Tamahere.

Ko Hoturoa te mana ō runga. Hoturoa is the figure with the 'hoe' or paddle in his hand, as he led the great expedition of the Tainui Waka to Aotearoa. Adjacent to Hoturoa are Mahinaarangi and her son Raukawa. While crossing the Waikato river, Mahinaarangi tied her son to her back, thus Tamahere was named. 'Tama' being boy or son and 'here' being to bind or tie.

Opposite to these designs and across the road, features 'Maungatautari' the tupuna maunga of the area. Within it's vicinity, stands our ancestor, Hauā, whom Ngāti Hauā derives from. He wields a 'patu' to signify his nobility and his prowess and below Hauā, is his father, Korokī. Korokī represents Ngāti Koroki Kahukura who are kaitiaki of Maungatautari.

On the other side of the ramp, is Wiremu Tamihana reading a bible. He was a devout Christian who used the teachings of the bible and matauranga maori to lead his people to peace. It is known that Wiremu Tamihana was born at Maniapoto Pā, a significant Pā that stood where the expressway now lays. Tamahere is also the place where Wiremu Tamihana laid down his taiaha to end the violence of the Land Wars. Below is his father, the revered warrior and battle strategist, Te Waharoa.

SH21 Underpass Project Update - 21st March 2022

Kia ora koutou,

I hope you are all keeping well. We are now working on the final stages of the project, with all major works completed.

On the southern (Country Club) side, a concrete cycle path has been poured at both ends of the new guardrail to allow cyclist access to the underpass from SH21. A hand rail has been mounted on the ramp and stairs. The next few weeks will see lights installed on the footpath outside the underpass and mulch added to the areas with topsoil.

On the northern (Tamahere) side of the underpass, the kerb has been poured and the handrails have been mounted to the ramp wall and staircase. The next few weeks will see guardrail installed, mulch added to the topsoil areas and a rock garden built behind the guardrail.

A layer of asphalt has been applied to the floor of the underpass to provide users with a higher level of skid resistance during periods of rainfall. A second coat of graffiti guard will be applied to the underpass in the coming weeks and the lights will be connected.

While the underpass may look complete in some areas, for your safety and our team onsite, we ask that people avoid trying to use the underpass until all works have been completed. A formal notification will be released when the underpass is safe to use.
