NOTICEABLE INCREASE IN COVID CASES IN OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY:

If you missed the email that was circulated on Monday morning, Week 3 started with a noticeable increase in positive Covid cases within our school community. We will no longer be notifying each class individually, as cases arise of children who have been at school while infectious. We will continue to contact the parents and caregivers of children that are identified as being symptomatic at school and who need to be cared for at home.

KEEPING CHILDREN HOME WHO ARE UNWELL:

If your child is sick, please do not send them to school. **Even if they test negative for Covid, but are feeling unwell, please do not send them to school until symptoms disappear.** This protects everybody - staff and students from unwanted winter illnesses.

Please be aware that we are struggling at the moment to find Relievers and we are working hard to keep our staff healthy.



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If your child is sick, please keep them at home, follow the guidelines for the illness and stay home for the recommended time frame set by the [Ministry of Health](#).

Daffodil Planting

On Wednesday this week, a group of Tamahere Model Country School kids with the help of their parents planted 5,000 - 6,000 daffodil bulbs. The bulbs were ever so kindly donated by the Waikato District Council and the event was organized by the Tamahere Community Committee. We ended up planting the daffodil bulbs in record time, nearly 35 minutes. There were around 30 kids, plus parents and staff.

We started off with pre dug trenches filled with buckets of daffodil bulbs. Spreading the daffodil bulbs around the trench was the easy part but then we had to place the dirt back over the bulbs. Finally, we finished off by raking the dirt to make the surface smooth and weedless.

One of the parents asked Mr Wickens, "How are you going to jet wash these paths?" Mr Wickens just laughed. Hopefully



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in the near future these bulbs will grow into beautiful daffodils to be enjoyed by everyone in the community.
