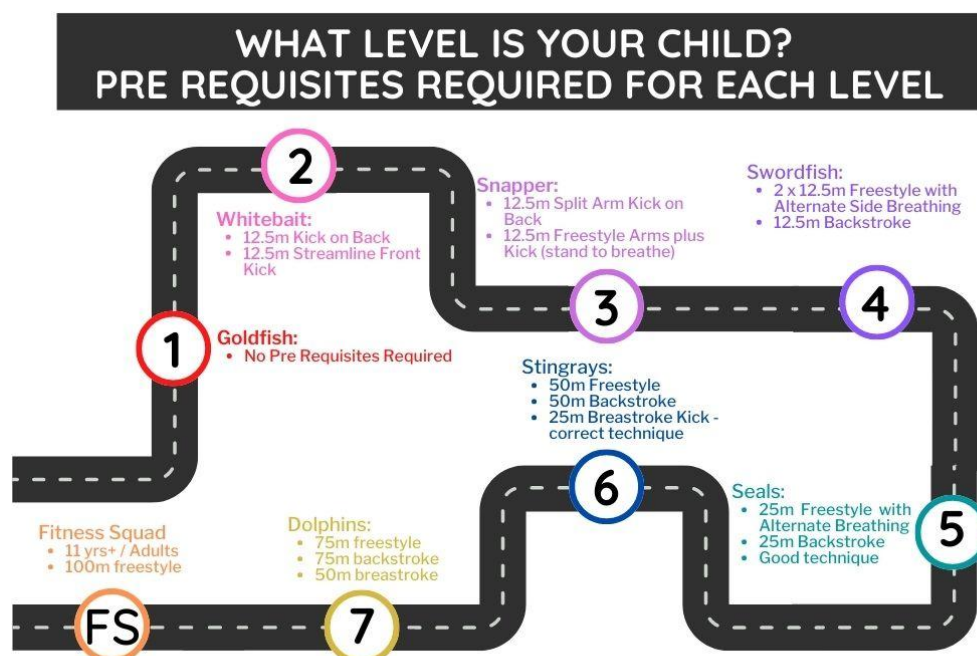

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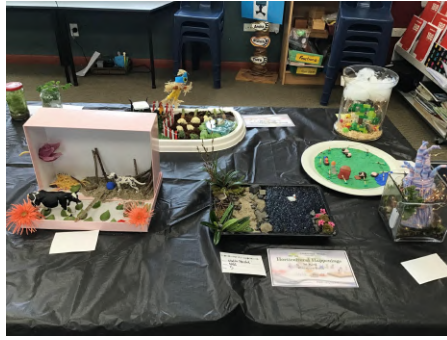
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## LIT QUIZ - The Sport of Reading

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## Waikato Community School of Music - Saturday Morning Music Classes

Enrolments are now open for Term Four 2022 at the Waikato Community School of Music. The first session is on Saturday 29th October.

The school caters for all ages (3 to retired) and ability levels, offering group-format and one-to-one music tuition in a range of instruments. Group-format class fees range from \$45 to \$110 per term (7 lessons in Term Four) depending on student age and the instrument chosen.
