NAU MAI, HAERE MAI! Welcome back everyone to Term 1 2023

What a summer holiday we have had - or not had! I hope you were still able to make the most of your family time and had a happy and relaxing break, despite all of the rain. It is always lovely to welcome our tamariki back for a new school year. The bubbling excitement and squeals of happiness as friends catch up again and new classes and opportunities are experienced, creates such a happy environment for us all, as we link back together.

It was very special to welcome our **29 new students**, **5 new staff** and **21 new families** to our school at the Whakatau on Wednesday. We were so proud of our Kapa Haka Roopuu and the three new leaders, who performed our karanga and led the haka. Well done Aria, Paige and Ethan - what a big step up for you all! Attendance: With some very concerning attendance rates across all schools in the country following three years of COVID restrictions and health issues, the Ministry of Education is wanting schools to actively check on all students attendance rates and absentee reasons. Please be aware that if your child's attendance is falling below expectations, we will be following up. Our 2022 data shows that some of our students averaged 1 to 2 absence days per week across the year and the impact on learning and achievement is significant. We understand that if your child has COVID a week of absence can happen quickly and we appreciate you keeping them isolated to help everyone else to remain healthy and at school.

COVID: Well, it is certainly still around and the Waikato is tracking quite highly with cases not far behind Auckland. Again, we thank you all for the support in keeping unwell students at home, so that they do not infect others. We have a number of at-risk students and families, who want to keep attending school. If you have COVID in your family, and your child is still well, we ask that students wear masks to help protect others from being infected. RAT testing as we know, may take days to show a positive result. If your child is unwell in any way, please keep them home, so that our teachers and other students can continue on at school. We will continue to keep classrooms well ventilated and encourage regular hand washing. Masks and hand sanitiser are available in all classrooms.

Our kaiako/teachers have been busy over the break working on learning programmes and we enjoyed two Teacher Only Days together, building our skills and knowledge around Literacy, Te Reo, Tikanga Maaori and swimming. We also enjoyed a team building afternoon biking from Cambridge to the Hamilton Gardens on the impressive Te Awa Cycle Trail.







Term One is a busy learning term for all of us, as well as one with lots of activities ranging from tabloids and swimming to camps and Kapa Haka.


