PIRONGIA FOREST PARK TRIP:

The Pirongia team of students, teachers and parents had a wonderful day at Mount Pirongia yesterday. We were greeted by our wonderful host and guide Kate, from the Mount Pirongia Lodge. The sun was shining and there were many things to explore.

The Pirongia students visited Mount Pirongia to learn about their Maunga. Our inquiry this term is all about being an explorer, so the students spent the day exploring the natural habitat of Pirongia. They meandered

through natural trees from the ancient forest, walking past large Rimu, Kahikatea, Tawa, Pukatea and Kohekohe trees and crossed over the Mangakara Stream, before looping back around on the Mangarakara Track.

The students discovered that there are many predators on Mount Pirongia that threaten the life of the natural wildlife and trees. We learnt about the types of predators that can threaten our natural birds and wildlife on Pirongia. The highlight for most of the students and even some teachers, was rolling down the huge hill.

We were so lucky to have many wonderful parents that gave up their time to help on the day. Thank you parents for your support. This trip would not be possible without you!

Here are some reflections from the Pirongia students about their day.

On our Pirongia trip, I really enjoyed the walk through the forest because I saw a lot of Nikau trees. Nikau trees were interesting because they grew straight up and their leaves branched at the top. I learnt that rabbits are pests because they dig holes and animals can hurt themselves when they fall into them.

On our Pirongia trip, I really enjoyed seeing Pirongia mountain because it is very pretty and I have not seen this mountain before. The orienteering was my favourite activity because we could draw the pictures we found. I learnt about the pests that hurt the Pirongia environment. They were scary for me. I never knew that cats can be a pest because they kill our native birds. This made me kinda sad. I also learnt that bunnies are pests because they dig holes and they eat the food from your garden. *Mia H*

We had a talk about pests in New Zealand. Rabbits were one of them because they dig holes in farmland and animals can get stuck. They need to be killed sometimes. Stoats: those ones are the worst! *Jamie J*

Orienteering was a lot of fun because I liked working with my group to find all the clues. I also enjoyed the Mangakara loop track walk because there were lots of interesting things to look at. I liked learning about the pests we have in Aotearoa and finding the pest footprints in the bush. It was interesting to see the different footprints that each animal makes. 


COUNTRY CLUSTER SWIMMING SPORTS:




PUMPKIN NIGHT 2023
