## **WAKA KOTAHI MESSAGE- New Pedestrian Crossing Nearing Completion**

Here is a message from **Waka Kotahi** NZ Transport Agency, providing an update to our school community on the safety improvement works at the SH21/Tamahere interchange, which are due to be completed shortly.

"The traffic signals for the new pedestrian crossing on the northbound on-ramp to the Waikato Expressway are due to be activated shortly.

Once these signals are activated anyone wishing to cross the road should push the buzzer and wait for the green signal before crossing. Remember to check for cars before crossing. Traffic management staff will be on site at the crossing for the first few days of operation to help pedestrians and cyclists adjust to the change.

The new crossing is one of the safety improvements now in place for people moving around and under the Tamahere interchange.

Other improvements completed at the interchange include:

- raised pedestrian crossing on the southbound off-ramp and Airport Road
- a two-metre wide footpath along Airport Road from Regal to Devine Road
- lighting improvements.

These changes ensure a safer journey for everyone as they move through this area. Waka Kotahi thanks you for your patience while this work has been completed."
