TMCS Cross Country

Our annual School Cross Country will be held on Thursday 24th of August at our school using the Tamahere Reserve.

Maungatautari Syndicate will be holding their cross country event at 8:45am and the Pirongia Syndicate at approximately 9:45am, with the Taupiri cross country starting at approximately 11:00am. These times are not guaranteed as running speeds dictate when each race starts.

We are pleased to be able to welcome you to enjoy this event with us once again this year. We ask that you please remain on the Tamahere Reserve area, where you will be able to see all competitors easily and keep your distance as you encourage runners along.



The postponement day for this cross country is Tuesday 29th August 2023.

Children are to wear their:

- Whanau shirt
- Suitable running shorts (skorts are okay along with uniform shorts)
- Running shoes.

Please ensure your child brings a change of warmer uniform to put on after their race as they may get wet, muddy and cold. We strongly suggest they also bring a towel, and bag suitable for their muddy belongings to go in. Please make sure your child has plenty of food and water.

<u>Disclosure of Risk:</u> Below are the possible risks your child could be exposed to on this day and the safety measures that are in place.

- 1. **Medical Safety** All students / parents are asked to ensure each child has their asthma inhalers with them and epi pens and other medication where required. Please ensure your classroom teacher is aware of your child's medical conditions. Our teachers are 1st Aid trained and we will have first aid kits available.
- 2. Exhaustion / dehydration / exposure All children need to have plenty of food and drink for the day and sunscreen along with enough warm clothes in case the weather changes. If the forecast is for rain a waterproof raincoat, outside of our uniform may be carried if it provides more protection than our uniform.
- 3. Loss Every year whanau shirts and other items seem to go missing please ensure all clothing items are clearly named and there are bags to carry them home.

LAST WEEK the vision was 'I value others and the environment' This is how some classes showed this vision throughout the week.












AG DAY UPDATE #4

Children are encouraged to keep a 'Pet Diary', which can include details about their Pet's breed, date of birth, feeding and health details, as well as photos and drawings.






This year children have two options:

- The first being a hard copy, which can be a notebook, clear file etc. What is included in it is up to you there is no set criteria.
- The second option is to create a google slide pet diary. To use google slides and create a
 visual presentation showing steps to care for the animals and photos showing them
 following these steps.

Here is an <u>example</u> to give you some ideas. Remember that you can also keep a pet diary about your Caged Pet or chicken.

VEGGIE GARDEN COMPETITION:

If animals aren't your thing, or if you think you have green fingers, why not enter the Vege Garden competition! Gardens can be planted at home any time after Saturday 26th August, and will need to be tended with a diary kept, right through to judging which will take place at the end of the October school holidays. Gardens can be any shape or size, and can be started from seeds or seedlings.






ANIMAL CONTACTS:

<u>Lambs:</u>

Coopworth Cross Lambs Available for Ag Day. Please contact Amy Beech on O21 542 547. Amy will be offering lambs to be raised, available from mid August. Lambs can be purchased from Amy for a small fee of \$60.00. If they are returned to her weaned after Ag Day, the fee will be refunded. Amy is able to provide advice on rearing her lambs too. Her lambs are usually popular, so it's helpful to contact her in advance to go on the waiting list for orphans.





Want to raise a chicken for Ag Day?

School families can now place an order through the school office for young 7 week old chickens to raise and enter in the Poultry category - orders limited to 2 chickens per family due to supply. \$26 each, supplied by Eureka Poultry Farm and to be collected from Tamahere school on Friday 25th August.

Student Enviro Team News

On Wednesday, we welcomed Jacques Boubee, a freshwater ecologist (river scientist) into our school. Students from Year twos to seniors found out lots of information about tuna. For example New Zealand eels are called tuna.

Did you know......

- That when eels are babies they are see-through?
- Did you know that eels have teeth like hooks?
- Did you know that eels can live up to 100 years?
- Did you know that the bigger the eel the more babies it has?
- Did you know that eels eat eggs even with the shell on?
- Did you know eels are the fastest-growing eel population in the country, growing 60% in the last decade, as compared with 7% growth of the general human population.



Jaques studied animals, has worked for NIWA and loves educating people on our local tuna. Here's what we learnt.....

What's special about eels?

Eels swim to the Pacific Ocean to lay eggs in Tonga and only 3% of the eels survive this journey back to NZ rivers!

We learnt that the larger the eels are, the more eggs they lay,
(a 70cm long eel can lay up to millions of eggs!) Eels like to eat anything - they especially like insects and worms served live.......

Bon appetit! Also they eat each other.



What are the problems eels are facing?

The key issue is the eel's environment is under attack. People build on eel habitats and land. They dig up land and ditches that eels use to travel and destroy their natural habitat.

What you can do to help:

Set traps for all their predators. Control weeds in the rivers.

Monitor our local eels, check out your creeks and gullies for eels.

Keep a count of the numbers you see.

Plant trees for shade near your rivers and creeks. Even plant willow trees as they give shade.


