

#### JUDGE'S DEMO DAY A GREAT SUCCESS:

Once you have your animal, if you have any health concerns, need to get it vaccinated or banded (castrated) please come along to our Vet Health Check Day on **Saturday 2nd September from 9.00am to 10.00am** in the carpark of the Tamahere Community Centre (TCC).

#### **PET DIARIES:**

Children are encouraged to keep a 'Pet Diary', which can include details about their pet's breed, date of birth, feeding and health details, as well as photos and drawings.

It is up to the child as to what they choose to submit for this, as there is no set criteria.

This year children have two options:

- The first being a hard copy, which can be a notebook, clear file etc. What is included in it is up to you there is no set criteria.
- The second option is to create a google slide pet diary, by using google slides to create a visual presentation showing steps to care for the animals and photos showing them following these steps.

Here is an <u>example</u> to give you some ideas. Remember that you can also keep a pet diary about your caged pet or chicken.

#### **VEGGIE GARDEN COMPETITION:**

If animals aren't your thing, or if you think you have green fingers, why not enter the Vege Garden competition! Gardens can be planted at home any time after Saturday, 26th August, and will need to be tended with a diary kept, right through to judging which will take place at the end of the October school holidays. Gardens can be any shape or size, and can be started from seeds or seedlings.
