



During his time in Australia, it was suggested he head to the United States and attempt to qualify for a spot at the Loretta Lynn Amateur National Championships for America. With a spot secured on the start line for the 65cc 8-9 year old Stock and Modified Class, Nico headed to Loretta Lynn's Ranch in Waverly, Tennessee in the first week of August, to compete against the best riders in his age group in the world. His results were outstanding, coming away with 1st place Overall win for the 65cc Modified and 5th 65cc Stock class!!! - Senior Team 11- 15 years

- One team member completes the swim, one team member completes the cycle and both complete the run.


