Kahui Ako Within School Leaders (WSL):

Laura Grant, Nanette Lister & Hayley Smit will be our Kahui Ako - Within School Leaders for 2024. They will be mainly focusing their inquiries and support for staff and students, in the Literacy, Digital Technologies and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) areas. Jasmine Saussey will be in support, with research supporting Agentic Learning.

Our School Structure and Organisation 2024

Below you can see the school structure and staffing for 2024. Each year our structure looks slightly different, depending on Ministry of Education funding for staff and student cohort numbers. This year, we will again be having three clear syndicates, with Maungatautari having Year 5 & 6 classes, Pirongia made up of Year 3 & 4 students and Taupiri will be taking the Year 0-2 classes.

Maungatautari Syndicate will have five classes in 2024, with each class having around 25-27 students, which is a great teaching and learning size for this age. Mrs Annette Howard will also be supporting in the literacy area, along with Teacher Aide Mrs Christine Woolley, supporting individuals and small groups across different learning areas.

Pirongia Syndicate will again have five classes of Year 3 & 4 students. Mrs Hayley Bacon will be the Syndicate Leader and will be teaching in Nikau One every morning. In the afternoons, Hayley will be released to undertake her Across School Leadership role with our Hillcrest Cluster Kahui Ako schools. Mrs Adele Hickey will be co teaching with Hayley and taking Nikau One every afternoon, once she has finished her Reading Recovery and structured literacy group lessons. There will be Teacher Aide support in this Syndicate.

Taupiri Syndicate will start the year with six classes. There will be three straight Year 2 classes this year and three Year 1 classes. Nicky Platje will again be taking our newest New Entrant Reception Class, in Horopito 20. As numbers grow in Term 2, Mrs Christy Paladin will join Mrs Platje, to provide consistency for all of our initial enrollments through to Term 4.

Teacher Only Days

We will be holding our first Teacher Only Day on **Tuesday 30th January** before we start back on Wednesday 31st, with a focus on Agentic Learning. This day will be facilitated by **Derek Wenmouth**. Agentic Learning is where students have more voice and take more leadership in their own learning. Our second Teacher Only Day will be on **Monday 5th February** which will enable families to have a long four day weekend, linking to Waitangi Day. This day will be spent looking at Restorative Practices as part of our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) development, led by Ministry of Education facilitators. More Teacher Only Days will occur during the year when needed. We will try and let you know well in advance.

E-Learning Devices

Our **Maungatautari** seniors will be using their chromebooks, as part of our Bring Your Own Devices (BYOD) programme. Our preference now is that students bring **chromebooks** and the school will provide the Ipads.

Year 3 & 4 students in **Pirongia** may, **if their parents feel they are ready** for it, bring a chromebook to school to support their learning.

On the last day of 2023 Year 3, 4 & 5 students were provided with a letter and further information on BYOD. If you did not receive this, please go to our website homepage www.tamahere.school.nz and click on the link at the top saying - 'Our Learning'. Next click BYOD and in here you will find everything you need to know.

Stationery Packs for 2024

Stationery Packs are available online. Go to: www.myschool.co.nz/tamahere and follow the prompts to complete your order.

You must place your order **BEFORE Wednesday 17th January**, to ensure delivery before school starts on Wednesday 31st January 2024.

The school office does not hold a large amount of stationery, so we will not be able to supply packs directly for your child. Please note that if you do not know your child's class at this stage, please purchase a stationery pack for the year level appropriate.

Tip:

Take advantage of the free delivery by "buddying up" with another family to ensure your order is over the minimum spend of \$70.00. Our school receives rewards for all stationery purchases made through OfficeMax.

School Donations / Activity Fees and Other Costs in 2024

At Tamahere Model Country School there are two different donations/fees that help support learning. The school depends on school donations to fund operations, facilities and learning to the high standard expected by our families. Many additional facilities and opportunities are only provided to students, due to the extra funding generously paid through the school donations.

You may have heard that since 2020 the government now pays school donations of \$150 per child to most schools. We are not eligible for this, based on our Equity Funding Level.

Understanding the real need for School Donations:

The Big Picture and Government Funding:

- Tamahere Model Country School has an EQI funding level of 368, decided by the Ministry of Education and School Funding by the Government is determined by this EQI rating.
- If our EQI level was higher, the school would receive approximately \$990,000 in Government funding per year.
- The reality is, for our school's EQI rating, we receive approximately \$550,000 per year, around 50% less than the highest rated schools.
- We have to try and make up the difference in this funding to be able to offer the facilities, teaching and support staff, and
 resources that we all want our tamariki to enjoy and benefit from, in order to offer them the learning opportunities we want
 them to have.
- School donations and various fundraising initiatives by our wonderful school community are the two main sources of funding to supplement what is provided by the Government.

What that means for Tamahere Model Country School:

- The Board of Trustees chooses to fund additional teacher time to support learning at our school.
- The Board of Trustees chooses to fund additional teacher aide time to support individual needs.
- The school owns a number of buildings over and above ministry owned buildings, including the library and Koromiko block, that we are responsible to maintain.
- The school turns 140 next year and the infrastructure continually needs replacing, maintenance is high and there are immense challenges to keep pace with exceptional growth in our school roll.
- Unfortunately, when operating funds are tight it's the additional-curricular spending that suffers.

Where does your School Donation go?

Your School Donation is added to the School's budget to support our learning programmes. In the past year school donations have allowed us to fund additional teacher hours, provide additional teacher aides in classrooms, and maintain school buildings and grounds. As well, sports equipment, books, musical instruments and extra materials for artwork are all school items paid for by your school donation.

The 2024 School Donations are:

\$240.00 per child for the school year
 This is just \$60.00 per child per term (or pro-rata depending on enrolment date)

Activity Fees:

Activity Fees are the second contribution and this covers specific costs related to cultural, academic and sporting activities that we undertake throughout the year, e.g. bus costs, visiting acts and entry fees.

The activity fee does not include camp costs or end of year trips.

This fee alleviates the need to constantly ask parents for small amounts of money during the year.

To ensure our students can enjoy the various activities throughout the year that extend and support their learning, we kindly request that all Activity Fees are paid by the end of Term 2 please:

\$65.00 - Taupiri Junior Syndicate

\$80.00 - Pirongia Middle Syndicate

\$90.00 - Maungatautari Senior Syndicate

(or Pro-rata depending on enrolment date)

Swimming Pool Levy:

The Swimming Pool Levy is \$20.00 per child per year. This money contributes to the ongoing maintenance of our wonderful pool facilities. The Vela Pool Complex, which opened in November 2017, allows us to offer increased swimming opportunities for our students, significantly above the level that was possible with the old ministry provided pool. Families agreed to help support the ongoing costs, to achieve such a great facility for our students.

Seesaw:

Tamahere School uses Seesaw, a digital portfolio that gives your child a safe place to record what they're learning at school and share that with you. The cost for Seesaw is \$5 per student for the year, which covers the licence cost for the programme.

Cyber Safety

School Manager - Family Zone

As a school, we have implemented a school and class management system called 'Family Zone' that provides our school and families with increased digital awareness, education and safety. This system has many benefits for both the school and our families. Teachers and parents have greater options to manage children's devices and the ability to set these up for safer learning, and monitor this with increased ease and visibility. The beautiful feature of Family Zone is that parents also have the option to set security and management boundaries in their home, with any device tool that connects to the internet (including phones, laptops, ipads, xbox, netflix.) to the level that a school can in their school environment. School Bus Arrangements for 2024:

Our school bus operator is Go Bus. To make sure that the start of the school year goes as smoothly as possible, please familiarise yourself with the information below.

As always, please either stay with your children while they are waiting for their school transport in the morning or keep in contact with them, to make sure that they are picked up safely. If the bus arrives at school prior to 8.00am, your child is required to go to Before School Care. (Please note - there is no charge for bus children to attend BSC.)

Eligibility For School Transport Assistance:

We often get questions about whether students qualify for school transport assistance i.e, a place on a school bus.

The Ministry of Education has three criteria that students must meet in order to qualify for school transport assistance. They are:

- 1. The student must attend their closest state or state-integrated school.
- 2. The student must live more than a certain distance from the school:
- o Years 1-8: Students must live at least 3.2km from the school, over the shortest public road or pedestrian route from the home roadside gate to the school's front gate.
- o Years 9-13: Students must live at least 4.8km from the school, over the shortest public road or pedestrian route from the home roadside gate to the school's front gate.
- 3. There must be no suitable public transport options.

The Ministry of Education has a handy <u>video</u> on their website, which helps explain the eligibility criteria for school transport assistance.

If you would like your children to catch the school bus, you will need to contact the Go Bus School Coordinator, Joanne Burman by emailing joanne.burman@gobus.co.nz to confirm their eligibility and then email the school office reception@tamahere.school.nz, so that your child is included in our afternoon bus roll.

Responsibility Of Caregivers:

To ensure a safe environment for bus loading and unloading, caregivers should:

- not park in bus bays
- adhere to the speed limit (20 km/h while passing a stationary school bus on either side of the road)
- try to eliminate the need for children to cross the road
- ensure that children get to and from the bus stop safely
- teach children to not run across the road

Dear Families,

We are pleased to let you know that our Learn to Swim Lessons at Tamahere Country Model School are now open and available to book online.

These lessons are available to any school age child and can be booked though our customer portal now.

These lessons will be run in the Tamahere Country Model School heated outdoor pool. While the pool is heated, being outdoors with varied air temperatures and element conditions will keep the water fresh. We suggest long sleeve togs and rash shirts for the children who may be sensitive to the cold.

Our lessons at Tamahere will follow the same detailed lesson plans as our Learn to Swim Lessons at St Peters and run by members of our current fantastic team.

Lessons will run daily Monday - Thursday from 3pm -5.30 pm from **November 13th - December 15th** and again in Term 1 **January 29th - April 12th**.

Please note that when enrolling your student, your booking will automatically roll over between the terms and you do not need to book twice for term 4 and term 1.

Please note that if you currently have an enrolment at St Peters Swim School, it can be transferred to Tamahere, however there is no guarantee that the same space will be available after these lessons finish.

All health and safety aspects of our lessons will apply here.

- All children under the age of 8 will always require a guardian with them during their lessons.
- . Lessons will only be cancelled in the event of thunder and lightening

Level Pre-Requirements

Goldfish: Pre Requirements

Beginner - no experience needed

Whitebait: Pre Requirements

- Full submersion/ retrieve toy from the floor
- Back float unassisted (5 secs)
- Streamline front kick 3m unassisted
- Back kick arms by side 5m unassisted

Snapper: Pre Requirements

- Back kick split arms 12.5m unassisted
- 3 strokes of straight arm freestyle, standing to breathe, for 12.5m
- 3 freestyle arm strokes + roll to back and kick for 3m's

Swordfish: Pre Requirements

- Side breathing with split arms 12.5m
- 4 x 12.5m of freestyle with alternate breathing
- 6 Kick backstroke 12.5m

Seals: Pre Requirements

- 25m regular freestyle (with good alternate side breathing)
- 25m backstroke (opposite arms and feet up)

Stingray: Pre Requirements

- 50m Freestyle: correct stroke technique
- 50m Backstroke; correct stroke technique
- 25m Breaststroke kick: Correct movement and glide

Dolphin: Pre Requirements

- 75m Freestyle: Correct breathing and technique
- 75m Backstroke: Opposite arms and feet up
- 25m Breaststroke: correct kick. arms and timing
- 25m Butterfly Kick plus breath: correct kick and breath

Before/After School Care (B/ASC):

At present we are trying to maintain the same costs as last year for Before/ASC. The After School Care hourly charge is **\$8 per hour** – capped at \$80 per week for 1 child, \$160 per week for 2 children and \$210 per week for 3 children. The capped rates give parents a discount, if children attend more than 10 hours a week. After School Care goes through to 5.45pm daily. There is a late fee penalty payment charged for children left after 5.45pm – \$10 for the first 15 mins and \$25 after 6.00pm.

Before School Care is charged at \$10 per session (7.00am until 8.00am)

Fee Structure BSC:

- · \$10 per day per child
- · One child per week capped at \$40
- · Family capped at \$100 per week

Sorry, we are not OSCAR subsidised.

Please note you will be notified/invoiced early in Term 1 for the School Donation, Activity Fee, Pool Levy and Seesaw subscription.

Did you know you can apply for a tax rebate from the Inland Revenue Department for your voluntary school donations? You may be able to get a rebate of up to one-third of the voluntary school donations you have paid if you:

- have earned taxable income
- · lived in New Zealand at any time over the tax year
- are an individual (not a company or partnership for tax purposes), and
- have paid voluntary donations to a state or state-integrated school

These have all raised significant funds towards our new shade areas. Thank you to everyone involved in coordinating, leading, organising and supporting these great events. In 2024 the money raised will support our budget and allow for extras to be achieved. It will mainly be going towards providing more shade areas and adding blinds and curtains to classrooms for safety and glare reasons.

Security:

Our school will be locked over the holidays. This is due to the increased vandalism and crime happening in the area.

Music & Kid's Clubs:

We have a variety of music and other extracurricular opportunities available for 2024. Itinerant tutors visit our school offering lessons in guitar, ukulele, piano, drums, singing and violin, to name just a few. Classes are also offered in gymnastics, Bricks4Kidz, and tennis. The camp can only host us for 3 days in 2024, the week before Easter, from Monday 25th Wednesday 27th March. - Pirongia Camp Our Year 4 camp will be held at Camp Raglan again in 2024, and the dates will be Wednesday 22nd Friday 24th May.

Children will be able to start school in cohorts but only after they have turned 5. There will be 2 entry points per term, one on the first day of term, and one at a mid-point during a term.
