

STEM Curiosity 2023

Our Year Two-Four tamariki delved into the various materials and tools offered by the STEM Curiosity Team with vigour and enthusiasm! The three sessions offered a true sensory experience, as our young scientists experimented with different textures, colours, sounds and smells. While some children preferred to investigate in a precise and orderly fashion, others were keen to throw themselves arm-deep into the process to see where this took them.

A Message from STEM Curiosity.......

Over the last few weeks, we have been grateful to have STEM Curiosity back at TMCS. Your children have perhaps enthralled you with dinner time conversations about mud-play and fizzy explosions? We have loved seeing the children enjoy deeply authentic, hands-on learning as they became more curious about Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM).

Play is so important for children. It develops inter-personal skills and their personality, stimulates innovation and simply brings them joy. Play reveals what we know and what we're curious about. Play also helps children develop problem solving skills, which they'll use throughout their lives.

STEM skills shortages in both the classroom and workforce (girls/women in particular) have been an issue for decades, despite STEM-based learning programmes equipping students with 21st century skills and knowledge. STEM students become creators of technology, not just passive consumers. Yet, many STEM activities still follow a prescribed success/failure methodology. In contrast, STEM-play builds life-long curiosity towards these crucial subjects in a stress and failure-free way.

SPONSOR-A -SCHOOL OPPORTUNITY:

STEM Curiosity is looking for funding to deliver their programme to more Waikato primary schools in 2024. We all win when children from all walks of life are offered opportunities to build curiosity in their learning. If you have capacity to support STEM Curiosity, we recommend you take it. Given the prescriptive nature of grants and fundraising, they are now turning to corporate sponsorship, with sponsor-a-school options (\$1000 for one day for 150-200 children) or options for naming rights to support the region.
