#### **PROFESSIONAL LEARNING DAYS:**

Our teaching staff returned to school on Tuesday 27th for a Teacher Only Professional Learning Day (PLD), with a focus on learning how to create more agentic learning environments and further develop student-centred learning approaches in our teaching practices. This is one of our whole school focus areas for the next couple of years. Our PLD was facilitated by a leading educator in this area - Derek Wenmoth.

On Monday, our teaching staff, Teacher Aides and After School Care staff all attended a Professional Development Day, facilitated by Janine McKay and Sheryn Hobbs. The focus was on how to develop and use restorative practices, to further enhance our nurturing and positive school culture based on our Vision.

Following this our staff attended a fun Team Building session at the Cambridge Bowling Club, in very hot conditions.

We run an extensive student leadership programme at Tamahere Model Country School to provide opportunities for our senior students to develop their leadership skills and build confidence, for when they step out into the next stage of their educational journey and beyond.




Different activities are designed for different age groups and the timings vary, with music lessons and gymnastics available during school hours and others on offer after school hours.












