# Term 1 Student Centered Learning Conferences - Wednesday 20th ALERT - 12:30pm pick up! & Thursday 21st March

This year **all of our learning conferences will include the children** who are at the centre of the conversations, to increase your child's ownership and understanding of their learning and the goals they are setting for their improvement. It is important that all

three points of the learners support triangle are linked into the same conversations - Student - Teacher - Parent. We are allowing **12 minutes** per conversation to allow a bit more time for everyone. If parents have a delicate issue to share with your teacher, maybe your child can pop out early or you can catch up at another time with your teacher.

To create the time needed and so that our younger students are not out too late at night, we will be having our literacy and numeracy blocks all morning until **12:30pm** and then asking those who can, to take your children home, so that teachers can start to meet with families and students individually. Our Senior Leadership team and Teacher Aides will be on site to cater for any students not able to be picked up early. Please let your classroom teacher know if this is the case, so we can make sure everyone is safe.

After School Care will operate from **2:30pm** as per usual and the bus will also be running at the usual time.

Our Learning Conferences (Parent Teacher Interviews) will run from 1.15pm through to 7.03pm on Wednesday 20th March and from 3.00pm till 5.34pm on Thursday 21st March.

Normal school hours will resume on Thursday 21st March, with our learning day concluding at the usual time of 2.30pm. Conferences will start after this.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused by our early pick up on Wednesday.

**One Conference per child:** So that each child can celebrate their learning journey with the ones they love and get all caregivers on the same page with the support required, we ask that all parents join together for this occasion, to support your child and enable teachers to have the time needed for all conferences. There are not enough spaces for our split family parents to have an appointment each. We appreciate your support in this matter.

## Football / Soccer at Tamahere Model Country School 2024


Thank you to all those who took the time to respond to our Football/Soccer survey. It really helps to see how people are feeling. We had 68 responses and the results are shared below to help give all of our soccer parents an understanding into why each family may make their individual decisions this year.


From the results of the survey, we will be offering *First Kicks* for our youngest footballers who are just starting out. We will also enter social teams into the younger grades and Year 5 & 6, if there are enough players to make the teams. We will offer as many teams as we have coaches and managers for. We completely understand that our more competitive players will be opting for the more structured club


environment. It is for each family and child to make their own decisions as to what is the best place for each player. From the results, we know we do not have enough coaches to sustain the number of teams we have had in the past and this has been getting increasingly challenging. We propose to increase the sub by \$10.00, to give us a buffer for the increased costs of balls and also to maybe give koha to any coaches from outside of our school. If there are skills sessions that cost, these will be invoiced separately but we can see most of our competitive players will be in the club environment. We are independent and families can choose to join whichever club works best for them. There are many clubs to choose from.




We do still offer many sports for our children to be involved in and to represent our school, from hockey & netball through to lacrosse, basketball and cycling.























#### **Use of Smart Watches**

At our school, we prioritise living our school vision - together as one (kia kotahi), confident can do kids (kia maia), and respect (kia manaaki) with our students. To support this, in this technological age, we have never allowed devices to be used during break times or for anything other than the learning and teaching happening in classes. Smart watches are a new toy for many and are not to be used for anything other than telling the time while at school. It is probably best to leave them at home for safety.

We are required to follow the government principle of "away for the day," which means that at Tamahere Model Country School all student phones should be switched off and handed to the teacher for safekeeping throughout the school day. Smartwatches however, may be worn solely to tell time and need to be turned to silent. They should not be used for messaging, including communication with parents or caregivers, during school hours.



Should a parent or caregiver need to contact their child for any reason during the day, please contact the school office and they will ensure messages are delivered. Please do not send emails to classroom teachers during the day and expect a reply or that a message will be actioned. Teachers are busy looking after their class and teaching at these times.

Similarly, if a student needs to contact a parent or caregiver during the day, they should inform their class teacher and parents will be contacted if it is appropriate.

## **Grandparents and Special Friends' Day**

To all grandparents and special friends', we excitedly invite you to spend the morning with the students and staff at Tamahere Model Country School on **Friday the 15th of March**. 




