## First Credit Union School Banking Programme



As you will know First Credit Union has been offering our School Banking programme to our schools for over 45 years. Over the last three years our School Banking Team have noticed a significant drop in the number of school banking deposits and the effects of Covid lockdowns and the ever-increasing cost of living has taken a toll on our school banking families.

We have made the difficult decision to cease our school banking programme at the end of Term One (12 April 2024). This decision was not made lightly, and we acknowledge the positive impact this programme has had on our school children and the relationships we have built with our school communities over the years. We are very grateful to you for allowing us to offer school banking to your community. First Credit Union remains committed to maintaining these connections with our schools and our teams will continue to engage with their school communities.

Although we are discontinuing the school banking programme, we are actively working on a new electronic product to replace it, with a primary focus on children's banking. We will provide you with further details on this new initiative as developments progress.

Our team will start advising our school banking participants as soon as possible via slips inserted into banking passbooks. It's important we reach as many of our school banking families as possible, to assist us we kindly ask that you display the attached poster on the school banking box/ in the office area. We have also provided some information for you to use in your school newsletter to advise your families of this decision.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support over the years and we have loved being part of your school community. We are still committed to supporting your school and children, so please continue to get in touch if there is anything we can help with.
