## Walking Bus to School During Fieldays' Week

Thank you to those who have already contacted us about being part of a walking bus to school during the Fielday's week. It looks like we have a reasonable number for a walking bus, to walk the 1.3 km from Woodcock Drive to school.

We keep sharing information that this year Fieldays traffic will be flowing towards the Mystery Creek site in two lanes in the morning. Families needing to go North East on Tauwhare Road will be unable to and will have to drive into Hamilton and around. There will be no right turn out of Pencarrow Road. Please be aware of this. Our suggestion, to save stress and hours in traffic is to meet at the end of Bruntwood Road and a group all walk together - walking bus style the 1.6 km to school, using the new lights and crossings with one or two volunteer parents. The same could happen from Woodcock Road with a 1.3km walk, and another group from Pencarrow Road and surrounding areas, could meet at St Stephens and use the underpass to walk around 500-700m across to the backfield. These walking buses would walk - weather permitting on Wednesday and Thursday (no school on Friday due to our Teacher Only Day).

If you are interested in this idea, can you please let the office know and we will try and coordinate something. The Fieldays traffic management may also be able to help the walkers to cross the Hamilton off-ramp for safety.



## Fieldays Friday - Teacher Only Day - 14th June:

Our School will be closed on Fieldays Friday - 14th June for a Teacher Only Day. This day is part of the MInistry's revised curriculum development schedule. Our staff will be looking at the Ministry's new directions with the Science of Learning. We have selected this day to



## Fieldays 2024 Traffic Update - From Fieldays themselves

Traffic congestion and flow could be an issue for those living and working around Mystery Creek; en route to and from work and/or school, places of work and areas like the Airport.

Please plan accordingly for these disruptions. This may include leaving home earlier for work before the traffic builds or working from home if possible.

#### **MORNINGS**

#### 5.45am - 11.30am \*\*

Mystery Creek Road will be one way from Mellow Road to Gate 5 heading north toward Hamilton Airport (refer to map).

Mystery Creek Road between Gate 5 and Gate 2 will be closed for the above duration; however, vehicles displaying the 'Neighbour' pass will be granted access.

While the one-way system is in place both in the morning and in the afternoon, there will be a manned road closure at the intersection of Mellow Road and Mystery Creek Road with access being granted for emergency services only.

For those properties on Mystery Creek Road beyond the road closure, access will be via McEldownie Road. At the junction of Kaipaki Road and McEldownie Road, a chicane will be in place to provide access to the area for all residents with a pass. This will enable vehicles to move to and from the junction without having to enter the oncoming traffic lane.

#### 11.30am - 1pm

Mystery Creek Road and Mellow Road will return to dual carriageway and all road closures will be removed.



#### **AFTERNOONS**

#### 1.00pm - 6.30pm \*\*

The road from Gate 5 on Mystery Creek Road to Mellow Road heading south toward Cambridge will be one way.

The road between Gate 5 and Gate 2 will be closed for the above duration; however, vehicles displaying the official 'Neighbour' pass will be granted access.

Neighbours residing between Mellow Road and Gate 2

If you are heading back during this time access to your property will be via Airport Road onto Mystery Creek Road through the road closure to Mellow Road.

#### 6.30pm - 5.45am

Mystery Creek Road & Mellow Road will return to dual carriageway and all road closures will be removed.

#### \*\* POLICE NOTIFICATION - Travelling on the Grass Berms

If the Police deem it not safe for residents to drive along the grass berms (particularly during heavy traffic going to/from Gate 5) they will NOT allow it. Police decisions override all traffic management decisions.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding around traffic delays and road closures during this busy time for the NZ National Fieldays Society.

## SH21 / Airport Road

We are implementing one change this year to address network congestion. A one-way system will be created on SH21, Airport Road from Raynes Road to SH1 (Tamahere Interchange.) Previous events have shown that the Narrows Bridge causes issues due to high traffic volume, resulting in major delays for people accessing the area with queues stretching for kilometers.

By removing oncoming traffic on the bridge during peak times, traffic flow will improve. The most significant congestion occurs in the morning between 8am and 9:30am, and in the afternoon from around 4pm, gradually easing after 5pm and returning to normal around 6:15pm.
