Cyber Security:- ALERT! To improve the security and firewalls in our school's online systems we are being completely re-organised internally with higher levels of security and separate access areas for devices linking to our wifi. On Monday 17th June after Fieldays, every device in our school needs to be accessed and re-configured to link to the new portal the device will access in our wifi. All students in Pirongia and Maungatautari who bring devices to school - at any time need to have their devices at school - fully charged and have their passwords clearly shown for the technicians to move over 400 devices to our new more secure system. N4L, our provider and TTS accredited technicians will be doing this for us. If your child is away sick could the devices please be brought to school on Monday by other family members so they can be linked to our new system.





Cohort Entry:-

Our school has been involved in Cohort Entry for our new five-year-old enrolments for the last few years. Initially, the advantages of this system were that all children benefited with a solid 8-week transition to school programme and started as a group. Also, younger students were able to attend earlier and gain more time at school giving everyone advantages.




Since the changes under the Labour Government when a mid-term date was added, a number of students are now disadvantaged and have to wait to start school rather than being able to start on their fifth birthday or before. As a school, we are looking into what is best for our students and

how to cater for individual needs better. We are considering withdrawing from the cohort system by the end of this year. We will still provide our eight-week transition programme for all students but will tweak our present system to cater for a more staggered start. Some students will arrive in clusters anyway at the start of a term. We will continue to have a Week One and a Mid-Term whakatau to welcome our groups of new arrivals and whanau before they join us officially.
