






<u>Learning Conferences - Week 2 Term 3.</u> <u>Wednesday 31st July & Thursday 1st August</u>

Teachers have been busy testing their students and are in the process of writing mid-year reports. These will go home in Week One of next term and Learning Conferences will happen in Week Two. Please be aware that on Wednesday 31st July we will focus on our three hours of literacy and numeracy until 12:30 pm. After this, students will head home and attend their learning conferences later that afternoon or evening or on Thursday 1st August.



We are so lucky at our school to have such strong partnerships between home and school. It has been shown that the strength of the connection between parents, school and students all working together to support the learner makes a huge difference for academic and social outcomes, and helping students to reach their potential. Our Learning Conferences with nga aakonga/students included are designed to reinforce this. Our conferences will be 12 minutes to enable time for a quieter one-to-one conversation if needed. Nga aakonga/students can pop outside for a short time.

Our Learning Conferences (Student, Parent & Teacher conversations) will run from 1.15 pm through to 7.15 pm on Wednesday 31st July and from 3.00pm till 5.12pm on Thursday 1st August.

- <u>Please note</u>: On Wednesday 31st July our school day will **finish at the earlier time of 12.30pm.** We will run two longer learning blocks to cover as much class time as possible.
- After School Care will start at 1.45pm. Please note that the bus will be running at the normal time of 2.35 pm. Bus students can go to afterschool care and then take the bus home, if parents wish.
- Normal school hours will resume on Thursday 1st August with our learning day concluding at the usual time of 2.30pm. Conferences will start after this at 3:00pm. We apologise for any inconvenience caused by our early conclusion of learning on Wednesday.

One Conference per child: So that each child can celebrate their learning journey with the ones they love and get all caregivers on the same page with the support required, we ask that all parents join together for this occasion to support your child and enable teachers to have the time needed for all conferences. There are not enough spaces for our split family parents to have an appointment each. We appreciate your support in this matter.

Before I go and buy new copies I am putting the call out to all families that might have these books at home in good condition and no longer need them and would be happy to donate them to the library.





Year 4 STEAM

On Wednesday the 19th of June, the Year 4's had a morning to themselves with no Year 3's. 😀 We did STEAM in two groups. All the Year 4's went to Nikau 1 or Kauri 2. In the first STEAM lesson, we made a diorama. I had to have an animal, (for example, a dinosaur, a fish, a shark, a dolphin) and for the background you could do a tropical beach, volcano, ocean or other. In Nikau 1, we made Oobleck. The ingredients were cornstarch, water, and, if you wanted, you could have food colouring, which made it cool and often pretty. After you made Oobleck and tidied up your space, you could go outside and play a game called 'No hands, build a tower' (with cups). So what you have to do is grab cups, a rubber band of any colour, and one piece of string per person in your group. Then you put one string at a time through the rubber band and hold it together, then put a knot in it. You do that to all the other ones and you all pull your string to stretch the rubber band and then try to get the rubber band over the cup to make a tower without using your hands. When you made a full tower without using your hands, you could give your group a point. I liked that because it was quite hard, challenging, but now you know that you can achieve making a tower without using your hands! And that was the Year 4's morning.

The back of the certificate will show your child's ICAS results and the login details, "TAP ID and Pin". - Use these to enter the Results Portal orti.icasassessments.com/ortiStudent.
