We will be having one of the allocated Ministry of Education approved **TEACHER ONLY DAYS on Friday 15th November.** The focus for this

day will be on the revised curriculum, and we are hoping to include discussion on the **new Mathematics** syllabus by this time. On **Monday 18th November, we will be taking another Teacher Only Day** which will be focusing on assessment and moderation, leading into end

BALLOT for 2025 Out of Zone Enrolments

Any out-of-zone families wanting to enrol a child at Tamahere Model Country School in 2025, need to apply to be in our ballot for Out-of-Zone placements by **Thursday 10th October.** The ballot will be drawn on Monday 21st October 2024.

For the first time in a number of years we will be offering possible placements across all ages of the school. This is due to the numbers we have presently in our age cohorts and the staffing that we are anticipating



being given. We will be losing a large Year 6 Cohort of students who are moving on from our school, which will upset the balance of our syndicates. By allowing a few more students into age cohorts, we will have one extra tool to help us manage our class groupings in 2025 and help to keep our syndicate numbers balanced. Depending on in-zone enrolments and priority categories, we may not use the numbers below but we can open up some places if needed to support better learning environments for all of our students/aakonga.

Please note if you are out-of-zone, **even if your child is a sibling of a current student, you must be in the ballot** to have a chance of your child being enrolled at our school in 2025. We will be offering **up to** - 10 places in Year 5&6, 12 places in Year 3&4, 10 places in Year 2, and 12 places in Year 1. Advertisements will appear in the wider community shortly.

HOW TO ENTER A VEGE GARDEN?

Vege Garden Competitions Timeframe:

The Vege Garden competition opens on Saturday, 25th August. Gardens must be started on or after this date, and can run until judging, which will take place at the end of the October school holidays (12/13 October). Prize winners will be announced at Ag Day.

The criteria is open to the children to decide what they would like to create. Get inventive and use your imagination! Gardens are not intended to be brought to school and *will be judged at the location of the garden* (home/residence). Entries can be something as simple as lettuce grown in an upcycled container, through to a project carefully thought through with an elderly neighbour or grandparent.



Children will need to keep a diary containing details on what, and when, they have planted. Plants may be started as seeds or seedlings and children should understand

basic principles, such as planning the garden, preparing the soil, watering, pest and weed management. Other than that, we are keen to see our children outside enjoying the fresh air, hands on and getting creative!
