

### **Keeping underwear private!**

**No Ethika underwear** is to be worn under shorts at school as we end up with multi coloured displays every time someone sits down! Any garments worn under school shorts and dresses for warmth need to be plain black, white or the same colour green. There should be no need for extra warm clothing to be worn in Term 4, as we have plenty of layers of school uniform.



### **Keeping Everyone Healthy**

Thank you so much for helping us keep as many as possible healthy and at school, by keeping unwell tamariki home - warm and rested. Many staff and children have taken a good week to come right. We know this can be very hard for working families but COVID showed us that isolation does work and keeps bugs at bay. We do apologise for your child having to have their class split at times when we have been unable to get relievers. Let's hope next term is a healthier one for everyone.

Recently we had a vomiting bug doing the rounds. If your child has had diarrhoea or has vomited, please do not return them to school for **48 hours**. Please see the Ministry of Health's chart below for more information.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is 3.00pm on Thursday 10th October 2024. Our ballot will be drawn on Friday 18th October 2024.


### PUMPKIN NIGHT 2025

### HOW TO ENTER A VEGE GARDEN?

### **Vege Garden Competitions Timeframe:**

The Vege Garden competition opens on Saturday, 25th August. Gardens must be started on or after this date, and can run until judging, which will take place at the end of the October school holidays (12/13 October). Prize winners will be announced at Ag Day.

The criteria is open to the children to decide what they would like to create. Get inventive and use your imagination! Gardens are not intended to be brought to school and *will be judged at the location of the garden* (home/residence). Entries can be something as simple as lettuce grown in an upcycled container, through to a project carefully thought through with an elderly neighbour or grandparent.



Children will need to keep a diary containing details on what, and when, they have planted. Plants may be started as seeds or seedlings and children should understand basic principles, such as planning the garden, preparing the soil, watering, pest and weed management. Other than that, we are keen to see our children outside enjoying the fresh air, hands on and getting creative!


**Sausage sizzle:** Forms will go home on day one of Term 4. Please return them the next day.






