Off Site Evacuation

We held a very effective off site evacuation drill yesterday. It involved everyone in our school relocating to St Stephen's church, once we had completed a standard fire evacuation practice. Our senior students/aakonga supported younger ones and everyone showed *kia manaaki / respect* and *kia kotahi / together as one* behaviours to ensure a safe and fast evacuation. We achieved the relocation in 15 minutes which is very good for our first full practice. With the underpass, we can easily move away from our school safely and get to a place where parents and caregivers can pick up their tamariki/children without congesting the school site with vehicles that could impede the emergency vehicles getting access. The practice highlighted a few areas we can improve on but was a positive experience and time to get together and walk during our day.



Principals Visit - On Tuesday we held a whakatau for a group of visiting principals from across the Waikato region, including Te Kuiti, Morrinsville and Hamilton. Our Kapa Haka Roopuu performed beautifully, and after kai, the principals did a school walk around to see our environment and the teaching and learning happening across our school. They were very impressed.

> Goldfish: Pre Requirements -Beginner – no experience needed

Whitebait: Full submersion/ retrieve toy from the floor Back float unassisted (5 secs) Streamline front kick 3m unassisted Back kick arms by side 5m unassisted

Snapper: Back kick split arms 12.5m unassisted strokes of straight arm freestyle, standing to breathe, for 12.5m 3 freestyle arm strokes + roll to back and kick for 3m's

> Swordfish/Seals: Side breathing with split arms 12.5m 4 x 12.5m of freestyle with alternate breathing 6 Kick backstroke 12.5m

Stingray/Dolphin 50m Freestyle: correct stroke technique 50m Backstroke; correct stroke technique 25m Breaststroke kick: Correct movement and glide

- bring a warm jersey and/or jacket
- all children should be wearing shoes for SHOT PUT. In all other events, they may have bare feet

Sun Safety - The children will be outside for most of the day, so will be exposed to the heat of the sun. Sun cream will be made available, but we ask that students wear sunscreen to school and to re-apply during the day. Children are also to wear their whaanau shirts and school sun hats.
