Maungatautari Camp

What fantastic experiences our Year 5 & 6 students/aakonga have been involved in over the last two weeks. We have had two four day camps at Waihi Beach and the Karangahake Gorge, with the syndicate split into two groups of 70 so we could fit into the facilities available. This area is rich in gold mining history and present day gold mining technology.



This is a significant outdoor education opportunity that we are able to provide our students that sadly, many schools no longer offer. The growth in student confidence, ability to manage themselves and develop new relationships is an important part of camp.

At this camp aakonga participated in a range of exciting challenges, worked closely together as a team, and had plenty of fun making memories in the great outdoors. Highlights included taking part in Beach Education, where they learnt important water safety skills, an adventurous outdoor hike that tested their resilience, and a refreshing river swim that brought lots of smiles and laughter. We are so proud of the way they represented our school, showing courage (kia maaia), team work (kia kotahi), and respect (kia manaaki) throughout their time away.


Friday 30th May: Term 2 TEACHER ONLY DAY


