Walking Bus to School During Fieldays' Week

Thank you to those who have already contacted us about your children being part of a walking bus to school, during the Fielday's week. We already have a number of volunteers but not across all 3 days.



Our three walking bus routes will operate, weather permitting, on Wednesday 11th, Thursday 12th and Friday 13th June.

For families impacted by the traffic management measures, one group could meet at the end of Bruntwood Road and a group all walk together - walking bus style, the 1.6 km to school, using the new lights and crossings with one or two volunteer parents.

The same could happen from Woodcock Road with a 1.3km walk, and another group from Pencarrow Road and surrounding areas, could meet at St Stephens and use the underpass to walk around 500-700m across to the backfield. These walking buses would walk - weather permitting on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. but only if we have enough parent volunteers across the three days.





Year 6 City Cluster Winter Sports Tournament 2025

Dear Year 6 Parents/Caregivers,

On Thursday the 29th of May your child will travel to Waikato University to compete in the City Cluster Winter Sports Tournament. We will be leaving school at 8.30am and will return by 2.30pm. Please ensure your child is at school by 8.20am, as we need to leave at 8.30am. We will meet on the Maungatautari courts.

The sports are spread across the University main field and St John's College (for hockey players) and there will be a Tamahere Model Country School teacher or parent based at each sport looking after our teams. See the map overleaf. The children will play one sport for the day and stay at that sport. The kaupapa for the event is participation and giving it a go, rather than winning.

Your child will need to have the following things: • School T-shirt or school sports top and shorts

- Comfortable sports/running shoes
- Special equipment for the sport they are playing mouthguard, shin pads and stick for hockey; boots or running shoes for rippa rugby; shin pads and boots (or running shoes) for football.
- Plenty of food and water for the whole day
- · School jacket/polar fleece for warmth
- Raincoat if needed

8.30am: Depart school9am: Arrive at sports venue

9.30am: Sports briefing - all parent managers to attend

9.40am: Games and/or warm-ups begin2pm: Wrap up and return to school

<u>Disclosure of Risk:</u> - Below are the possible risks your child could be exposed to on this day and the safety measures that are in place.

- 1. Road Safety We will be traveling by bus to Waikato University. All children will be seated and wearing shoes in case we have to exit onto the road side.
- 2. **Medical Safety** All students / parents are asked to ensure each child has their asthma inhalers with them and epi pens and other medication where required. Please ensure your classroom teacher is aware of your child's medical conditions. First aid kits will be carried.
- 3. Exhaustion / dehydration / exposure All children need to have plenty of food and drink for the day and enough warm clothes. We never know the weather, so a waterproof raincoat outside of our uniform may be carried if it provides more protection than our uniform.
- 4. Loss of property Please ensure all clothing items are clearly named.




