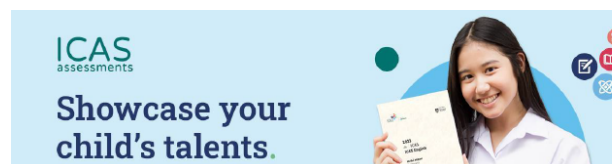

Fortunately, both Leo and Jack have bikes which are well-equipped for such conditions, with large mud tyres a must! Jack was racing in the 4-7 years Intro Trail 50cc 4 Stroke class, and Leo was in the 7-11 years Trail 51-149cc 4 stroke class. The Tamahere School team of two performed admirably with Jack bringing home 2nd place overall, and Leo finishing 11th after pushing so hard and crashing multiple times per race, but fighting his way back through the field each time. Outstanding effort from both lads, resulting in TMCS finishing 18th overall out of 71 primary schools!




