NOTICE OF PROBABLE STRIKE: Please be aware of this!

Due to the legally notified and expected Strike organised by the NZEI Union for Primary School Teachers, Primary School Principals and Primary School Support staff on **Thursday, the 23rd of October**. Our School Board has decided to close our school for the day. Please see the details around this decision below.

1. The Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 (HSWA)

As the PCBU (Person Conducting a Business or Undertaking), the Board has a primary duty of care to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health and safety of our students and remaining staff.

2. The Education and Training Act 2020

The authority to close the school is provided under the Education and Training Act 2020 and its supporting regulations, which allow a school to close due to a lawful strike action.

The strike is lawful, as the union has provided the required 3 days' notice under Section 589 of the Act.

By closing the school for instruction, we are formally acknowledging that we cannot meet the regulatory requirement to be open while upholding our overriding duty of care to our students' safety.




ROAD & CARPARK SAFETY REMINDER:

In our final Newsletter for Term 3, we alerted our parent community to concerning driver behaviour in and around our school, in particular the carpark area adjacent to the TCC, near Gate 7. Unfortunately, we have received two further reports this week.

Please remember to:

- Respect and obey the NZ Road Rules, by reducing your speed around our school
- Stop and look for pedestrians. Be mindful of children walking out onto the crossing.



We wish to remind all our school families that young children are at higher risk as pedestrians in car parks, especially if not supervised by an adult because:

- They are still developing their directional hearing and peripheral vision. They are smaller in stature, which makes it difficult for them to see past parked cars. They can be impulsive, unpredictable, easily distracted and have a limited concept of danger.
- 2. They have difficulty judging the speed and distance of oncoming vehicles.

Please drive slowly and make sure you are absolutely certain where children are, before moving your car.

We are pleased to let you know that our Learn to Swim Lessons at Tamahere Model Country School are back again! They are open now and available to book online. These lessons are available to any school age child whether they are St Peter's Swim School student or not. Lessons in Levels Goldfish – Seals will be taught at Tamahere



and can be booked though our customer portal.

These lessons will be run in the Tamahere Model Country School heated outdoor pool. While the pool is heated, being outdoors with varied air temperatures and element conditions will keep the water fresh. We suggest long sleeve togs and rash shirts for the children who may be sensitive to the cold.

Our lessons at Tamahere will follow the same detailed lesson plans as our Learn to Swim Lessons at St Peters and will be run by members of our current fantastic team.

Lessons will run daily Monday – Wednesday from 3pm - 6pm from **Monday November** 10th – Wednesday December 10th and again in Term 1 Monday 9th Feb – Wednesday March 11th.

Please note that when enrolling your student, your booking will automatically roll over between the terms and **you do not need to book twice for Term 4 and Term 1.**

Please note that if you currently have an enrolment at St Peters Swim School, it can be transferred to Tamahere, however there is no guarantee that the same space will be available after these lessons finish.

All health and safety aspects of our lessons will apply here. This includes:

- All children under the age of 8 will always require a guardian with them during their lessons.
- Lessons will only be cancelled in the event of thunder and lightning.






